CHANGES AND REPAIRS TO THE EXTERIOR OF YOUR PROPERTY

Pursuant to the Declaration of Deed Restrictions and Covenants for each section in Newport, "no construction or erection of improvements upon any lot, tract or parcel contained in Newport, however classified, shall ever be commenced until the written approval of the Architectural Control Committee shall have been received."

Listed below are items that require ACC approval. This list is not all-inclusive:

- Construction or installation of any building, including sheds.
- · Any addition to an existing building.
- Construction, installation or repair to any fence.
- Replacement of windows, gutters, wood, and siding.
- Exterior paint of any building located on your property.
- Removal of trees (except dead trees).
- Installation or replacement of walkways, driveways and/or extensions.
- Construction of any patio or addition to an existing patio.
- Replacement of roof (prior approval not required in the event of an emergency, but home improvement request form is required with type of roofing material, etc.
- Flag poles.

Home Improvement Requests ("HIR") are available on our website under resident documents. A completed HIR along with a copy of your plot plan showing the location of your improvement is required. The ACC committee meets the first and third Friday of the month (exception - month with five Fridays or Holidays). The completed HIR form must be received the Wednesday before the meeting.

Paint chips are required for all painting (even if it is the same color as the existing improvement).

RESTRICTIONS AND GUIDELINES PERTAINING TO:



RV'S, TRAILERS AND BOATS

The restrictive covenants for each section of Newport state that "no boat, boat trailer, travel trailer, camp trailer, house trailer, or other similar property shall ever be stored on any lot, tract or parcel contained in Newport without the prior written approval of the Architectural Committee."

The Architectural Control Committee as a general rule allows boats and RV's to remain in a resident's driveway for a period not to exceed forty-eight (48) hours prior to leaving or returning from an outing. The boat, trailer or RV must remain out of public view at all other times.

SIGNS

The restrictive covenants for each section in Newport state "No signs, billboards, posters or advertising devices of any character shall ever be erected upon or allowed to exist on any lot, tract or parcel contained in Newport, without the prior written consent of the Architectural Committee.

The Architectural Control Guidelines permit:

- one (1) for sale or for rent sign not to exceed thirty-six (36) inches (exception golf course properties may have two (2) signs front and back yards).
- Home Security signs not to exceed twelve (12) inches.
- Contractor signs (must be removed within one week after completion of work).
- Political signs ninety (90) days before election see Guidelines size and restrictions.
- School Signs relating to student activities not to exceed six (6) square feet see Guidelines for additional requirements.

NEXTDOOR NEWPORT

Nextdoor Newport is a private online network. On our Nextdoor site, neighbors share community events, recommendations, items for sale, crime reports, ideas about how to improve our neighborhood and more.

Currently, there are over 1,000 residents signed up. It's a great avenue to keep up with lost and found pets, items for sale and other information.

Nextdoor is also linked to the Harris County Sheriff's Department where the Sheriff's Department can send out blasts regarding happenings and news but they cannot access our private messaging.

ASSESSMENTS ARE DUE ON THE FIRST OF EVERY MONTH 2017 Assessments - \$50 per month

Assessments received after the last day of the month in which they are due are subject to a monthly late fee of \$5 plus interest at the rate of 6% per annum. Assessments that remain delinquent for a period of four (4) months will be subject to an additional monthly collection fee of \$15.

AMENITY CARD REQUIRED TO ACCESS SWIMMING POOL ... FITNESS CENTER ... LAKE & RIVER


There is an annual \$25 charge per household for the amenity card. One card may be shared by the entire household or you may elect to get up to four additional cards at an additional fee of \$5 each.

If you have a boat, there is an additional \$25 launch fee.

Lake & River Key is a one-time charge of \$30 [only one key per household].

Fitness Center Key Fob is a one-time fee of \$20 [max of two fobs per household at \$20/each].

Cards expire 12/31st each year.




HOW TO REPORT A STREET LIGHT OUTAGE

NEWPORT HISTORY

On August 23, 1972, a company out of Diamondhead, MS began a vision to develop 5,900 acres in Harris County with improvements that included three 18-hole golf courses, a marina, country club, yacht club, equestrian center, boat storage and thousands of home sites. That company was Diamondhead Corporation.

The first area to be developed was our community as we know it. Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 were platted in 1972 and in August 1972, the first lots were sold. In the late 80's, the property was sold to Newport Partners. Not being able to make a go of it, Newport Partners split the property, conveying 3,000 plus acres to an investor group from China. The remainder of the property, comprising Newport and a few hundred acres adjacent to Newport, remained with Newport Partners who filed for bankruptcy. In February 1999, Rampart Properties Corporation purchased the property out of bankruptcy. At that time, there were approximately 1100 homes in Newport and the amenities and common areas needed much TLC. The amenities and common areas were purchased by the NPOA and, if you have lived here for any length of time, you can see the amazing difference.

We have come a long way and now have over 3800 homes in Newport and we are still growing.



A total solar eclipse will take place on Monday, August 21, 2017. A solar eclipse occurs when the Moon passes between Earth and the Sun, thereby totally or partly obscuring the image of the Sun for a viewer on Earth. A total solar eclipse occurs when the Moon's apparent diameter is larger than the Sun's, blocking all direct sunlight, turning day into darkness. Totality occurs in a narrow path across Earth's surface, with the partial solar eclipse visible over a surrounding region thousands of kilometers wide.
