


DEBRIS SEPARATION GUIDELINES

First Pass Happening Now into September



DEBRIS SEPARATION GUIDE

Debris should be placed curbside, without blocking the roadway or storm drains. Precinct 3 crews will make at least three passes in your area.



DEBRIS SEPARATION

Separate debris into the six categories shown below.

DO NOT STACK OR LEAN

Placing debris near or on trees, poles, or other structures makes removal difficult. This includes fire hydrants, meters, and mailboxes.

UNSURE WHERE TO PLACE DEBRIS?

If you don't have a sidewalk, ditch, or utility line in front of your house, place debris at the edge of your property before the curb. Use clear trash bags for loose debris.

No Pickup Zone

Any debris placed from the sidewalk toward your property will not be picked up.



Normal Household Items

Normal household trash and bagged debris of any kind will not be picked up with disaster debris. You should continue to follow your normal garbage removal schedule.



Vegetative Debris

- Leaves (in clear bags)
- Logs
- Plants
- Tree Branches



Construction & Demolition Debris

- Building materials
- Carpet
- Drywall
- Furniture
- Lumber
- Mattresses
- Plumbing



Appliances & White Goods

- Air Conditioners
- Dishwashers
- Freezers
- Refrigerators
- Stoves
- Washers, dryers
- Water heaters



Electronics

- Computers
- Radios
- Stereos
- Televisions
- Other devices with a cord



Normal Household Waste

Household hazardous waste (HHW) such as paint (oil-based and latex), automotive chemicals, batteries, and lawn chemicals. HHW will not be picked up with regular debris piles. Harris County will notify all residents about HHW collection dates and drop-off locations.

NOTE: Appliances, white goods, & electronics will require proof of registered storm damage for pickup. Non-emergency storm debris cleanup will be coordinated by planned street routes, giving residents notification, not by a first come, first serve basis.

For emergency roadway obstructions (i.e.- downed trees), call Harris County Precinct 3 at 713-274-3100 or report online at pct3.com/service-request.
